The Memorial Garden features the World War II and “Operation Iraqi Freedom” monuments. Both monuments list the 6<sup>th</sup> Cavalry soldiers who died while serving their country. The Memorial Garden is located in front of the flagpole of the Army Post at Fort Oglethorpe (1902 – 1946).

Since 1981, the museum has told the story of the “Fighting 6<sup>th</sup> Cavalry” and the military legacy of the Army Post at Fort Oglethorpe. This patriotic tribute is open to all regardless of military service

Dear Association Member:

I am pleased to be able to send this letter to you about your 6<sup>th</sup> Cavalry Museum and update you on our progress.

“Remembering Our Heroes” was held September 4, 2010 with close to 1,000 living historians, visitors and association members attending. The polo field was transformed to France, 1943 with re-enactors, authentic vehicles and living history displays. Gen. George Patton (Denny Hair from Houston, TX) rallied the troops before battle with his famous speech (PG version as children were present) and provided historically accurate commentary for the battles.

Gen. Patton’s grandson, George Patton Waters spent the day on the polo field visiting with our veterans and guests, then spoke at dinner about his famous grandfather. Two hundred people attended the dinner and supported the silent auction to benefit the museum.

“Remembering Our Heroes” for 2011 will be held September 3. Here are a few of the highlights:

- School Day Program held on Friday, September 2.
- German Tiger Tank that Steven Spielberg commissioned for the movie “Saving Private Ryan” will be on display and participate in the battles.
- Gen. Patton and his Third Army Living Historians will join us again. Rumor has it that Patton has agreed to be a judge for the “S.O.S.” Cook-Off.
- The evening ends with the USO dance and live orchestra music of the Sweet Georgia Sound swing band.
